

SIMPLEX PROJECTORS "THE WORK HORSE OF THE INDUSTRY"

Simplex is the oldest and most trusted name in film projection systems, dating back to 1909.

Edwin S Porter, director of "The Great Train Robbery" left the employer of Edison and bought the Precision Machine Company, which produced the Simplex projector around 1909. He had improved the design of the Edison Exhibition Kinetoscope and was responsible for the Super Simplex which was introduced in the early 1930's.

Legendary products include the Simplex Regular (1909), the Standard (1916), the Super (1928), the E7 (1937), the Simplex XL (1949) and other products.

The Simplex Projector Company was purchased by Ballantyne of Omaha, Inc. / Strong International in 1983, and all manufacturing was relocated to the company's Omaha, Nebraska facility in America's heartland.

There are many reasons Simplex are the most popular professional film projector in the world, and it's not just decades of service and superior performance.

There are many Simplex standards and XL's projectors still in daily service, more than 30,000, of them, and many of those nearly 90yrs old. The tradition of quality and excellence continues today with the modern era Simplex 35mm and 70mm Projectors
